

SNOW LEOPARD (12A)

Director: Pema Tseden

Starring: Jinpa, Ziqi Xiong, Tseten Tashi

China, 2023, 1 hour 49 minutes, Tibetan/Chinese + English subtitles

A family dilemma: a magnificent snow leopard has been trapped by a shepherd. It has killed nine of his sheep and he wants to destroy it, but his father and younger brother, a monk, do everything they can to dissuade him.

The film is a conflict of bare faced, furious capital demanding redress, and the traditional Tibetan view that the snow leopard, as part of the animal kingdom, should be protected.

Pema Tseden, who unexpectedly died last May, probably from a heart attack brought on by altitude sickness, had been responsible for a new wave in Tibetan cinema. And he believed in working within the system.

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'Pema Tseden sharply draws a number of fault lines that run through his highaltitude tale. The Tibetan ethnic minority struggling with the rigidity and condescension of Chinese authorities has been a recurring theme in Pema Tseden's oeuvre, but *Snow Leopard* adds the rural-urban divide within the Tibetan minority itself as well as the friction between farming and nature preservation in precarious natural habitats. The film handles these themes with subtlety through small differences in the way the various characters act, speak, or even how and what they eat...This results in a balanced film where the viewer can see where each character is coming from, and that right and wrong in this situation are fluid...
